### ANNUAL REPORT OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS

The 2017-2018 fiscal year was another very busy one for the Beach and East Toronto Historical Society (TBETHS). The Board of Directors election at the Annual General Meeting was followed by the Executive and functional appointments:

- President: John Ellis
- Vice-President: Uwe Sehmrau (HCD Committee Chair)
- Treasurer: Mary Campbell
- Secretary: Deborah Livingston-Lowe
- Membership Secretary: Barbra Myrvold
- Program Convener: Glenn Chadwick
- At Large: Clyde Robinson (Website Committee Chair)
- Honorary Adviser: Gene Domagala

We held nine board meetings, the annual general meeting in May, ten public meeting events, and:

- We formed a Website Committee chaired by Clyde Robinson and further developed our website ([tbeths.ca](http://tbeths.ca)), assisted by Pete Richardson, President of Tayson Information Technology, a local company;
- We added a section for local history studies, the first being about pioneer hotelkeeper, Clem Dawes, prepared by Melanie Milanich and John Ellis;
- We led adoption of revised Constitution and By-laws;
- We maintained membership and revenue;
- We attended a Heritage Conservation meeting and called for identification of historic sites in Wayfinding;
- We are developing a plan for making heritage conservation a city-wide election issue in 2018;

- Uwe Sehmrau, Chair of our Heritage Conservation District (HCD) Committee, addressed the City Planning and Growth Committee to express concern over Heritage Preservation Services lack of staff resources to adequately process HCD nominations; in particular, our own submission for Queen Street East in the Beach;
- We developed a plan for plaques on historic sites, and restored the Glenn Gould plaque on Southwood Dr.;
- We continued work on a Board Handbook to define policy and functions;
- We filed required reports with the Ontario Historical Society and the Ministry; and
- We maintained membership in the Ontario Historical Society and in the Toronto Historical Association.
