292 Main Street: a triumph for heritage preservation!

The heritage building that has stood for more than 130 years on the west side of Main Street between Danforth and Stephenson avenues has been preserved, thanks to the initial efforts of TBETHS, the hard work of city staff in Heritage Preservation Services, the support of elected officials, and the goodwill and cooperation of private developers.

"A rare example of an Ontario Cottage style house-form building in the area", the building was constructed in 1887 by Donald George Stevenson, one of East Toronto's most important early residents. Threatened with demolition, it will be relocated slightly north and east, and incorporated into a new 27-storey tower to be constructed at what is now 276-296 Main Street.
